188 Backside: from OE *baec,* 'a back'; used topographically of a ridge, varying from a low ridge in marshy ground to a steep escarpment'; from OE *sid* 'large, spacious, extensive, long'; 'a large or long ridge'

189 Down Field: from OE dūn, ME doun(e) 'low hill', 'upland pasture'

190 Broom Hill Lane: from OE *brom* 'the plant broom'; from Anglian *hyll* 'a natural eminence or elevated piece of ground'; 'the lane through the hill of broom'

191 Dark Lane Field: from OE deorc 'dark, obscure, gloomy'; 'a gloomy lane by a field'

192 High Field Close: from ME clos 'small, enclosed piece of land'; 'a small, enclosed, high field'

193 Little Murt Mead: uncertain, possible personal name Murt; from OE mæd, ME meadow; grassland'; 'Murt's little meadow'

194 Hop Garden Field: 'the field where hops are grown'

195 Fig Dean: from OE *Fygla* 'personal name', from OE *denu* 'valley'; 'Fygla's valley'.

196 Hook Field: from OE hoc, ME hok 'angle, corner or bend of land'

197 Nurse Vere: Nursery, 'land on which young trees and shrubs are grown until ready for transplantation'; from ON vior 'a wood'

198 Sheep - House Close: from Anglian *scep '*a sheep'; from ME *clos* 'small, enclosed piece of land'; 'a house with a small enclosed piece of land holding sheep'

201/202 Bevil Common Downs: Possibly from OF baivel, 'sloping from the horizontal or vertical'; 'sloping common downs'
